

# Amtrak Fact Sheet, Fiscal Year 2004 State of Wisconsin

## **Amtrak Service & Ridership**

Amtrak operates one long-distance train through Wisconsin, the *Empire Builder* (daily Chicago-Milwaukee-St. Paul-Seattle/Portland via Columbus, Portage, Wisconsin Dells, Tomah, and La Crosse), and one short distance service, the *Hiawathas* (seven round-trips daily between Milwaukee and Chicago).

During FY04 Amtrak served the following Wisconsin locations:

#### **Procurement/Contracts**

Amtrak expended \$7,788,648 for goods and services in Wisconsin in FY04. Most of this money was spent in the following locations:

## **Employment**

During fiscal year 2004, Amtrak employed 104 Wisconsin residents. Total wages of Amtrak employees living in Wisconsin were 5,129,011 during this period.

#### **State-Assisted Services**

The State of Wisconsin, in partnership with the State of Illinois, funds the operation of the *Hiawatha Service* between Milwaukee and Chicago.

## **Station Improvements**

A station replacement project is planned for Sturtevant, with construction expected to begin in FY05. A major station renovation project in downtown Milwaukee also is expected to begin in FY05. The state will open a new station at Mitchell International Airport in Milwaukee on January 18, 2005.

# **Selected Highlights**

The *Hiawathas* had a double-digit increase in ridership in FY04 (+10.3%). This corridor has the best ontime performance in the Amtrak system, 93.0% in FY04.
