

Amtrak Fact Sheet, Fiscal Year 2005 State of Wisconsin

Amtrak Service & Ridership

Amtrak operates one long-distance train through Wisconsin, the *Empire Builder* (daily Chicago-Milwaukee-St. Paul-Seattle/Portland via Columbus, Portage, Wisconsin Dells, Tomah, and La Crosse), and one short distance service, the *Hiawathas* (seven round-trips daily between Milwaukee and Chicago).

During FY05 Amtrak served the following Wisconsin locations, which had a 13.6% increase over FY04:

Amtrak is upgrading equipment and amenities on selected long-distance trains, and the first train to be relaunched with these upgrades was the *Empire Builder*, in August 2005.

Procurement/Contracts

Amtrak expended \$11,765,696 for goods and services in Wisconsin in FY05. Most of this money was spent in the following locations:

Employment

During fiscal year 2005, Amtrak employed 101 Wisconsin residents. Total wages of Amtrak employees living in Wisconsin were 5,138,324 during this period.

State-Assisted Services

The State of Wisconsin, in partnership with the State of Illinois, funds the operation of the *Hiawatha Service* between Milwaukee and Chicago.

Station Improvements

Construction has begun on a station replacement project for Sturtevant and a groundbreaking ceremony was held on September 24, 2005. Completion is expected in April 2006.

A major station renovation project in downtown Milwaukee also is expected to begin in FY06.

The state opened a new station at Mitchell International Airport in Milwaukee on January 18, 2005.

Selected Highlights

The *Hiawathas* had a double-digit increase in ridership in FY05 (+14.1%). This corridor has the best ontime performance in the Amtrak system, 91.6% in FY05, and is the 8th-busiest corridor in the country.
